- Shared accomplishments during her tenure. Asked sorors to consider joining the National Council of Negro Women. See the Corporate Report for accomplishments.

#### Report from National Constitution and Bylaws Committee- Sorors Madison and Rivalte

- Motion to adopt Amendment 3 – Membership intake to be submitted to RD for processing as outlined in the APMI. Adopted.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 7- Collegiate Advisors must be knowledgeable of chapter operations, governing documents, administrative resources and tools. Adopted
- Motion to adopt Amendment 8 – Alumnae applications for chapter establishment must be submitted for processing and completed within 12 months from the date of the submitted application. Adopted.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 1 – GPA requirement for collegiate membership intake from 2.75 to a 2.85 on a 4.0 scale and from 1.75 to 2.14 on a 3.0 scale. Motion failed.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 2 – GPA requirement for alumnae membership intake from 2.75 to a 2.85 on a 4.0 scale and from 1.75 to 2.14 on a 3.0 scale. Motion failed.
- Amendments 9 and 10 withdrawn. Dealing with the International President’s establishment of an appellate panel for second level appeals and the duty of the National Board of Directors to serve as the second level appellate body.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 4 – Collegiate advisors must be a member of the alumnae chapter for four years (changed from 2 years) and in front of the word advisor change to the primary advisor shall be a member of the alumnae chapter for four years. Motion adopted.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 5 – Collegiate advisors must be a member of the alumnae chapter for four years who resides in the community (changed from 2 years) and in front of the word advisor change to the primary advisor. Motion adopted. Will return to Amendment 6 in Plenary VI.

#### Friday, July 11<sup>th</sup>

- Attended Plenary V, VI and VII
- Meet the Candidates – Soror J. Baker presented the candidates. Each candidate shared their platform.
- Back to Constitution and Bylaws- Motion to adopt Amendment 6- Collegiate advisors convention and conference attendance requirements. Change from one of last two National Conventions or Regional Conferences to at least two of the last three National Conventions and two of the last three Regional Conferences. Motion failed.
- Will come back to Amendment 11 & 12.
- Then Soror Pamela E. Smith introduced the founder of Courageous Conversations Global Foundation. A workshop they provide on a movement to have parts of history erased. She shared a video called [America Erased](#). Shared information from James Baldwin’s book, *The Fire Next Time*. She also shared that the process has 4 steps: stay engaged; speak your truth; experience discomfort; expect and accept non-closure.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 11- Special Scholarship- added 1<sup>st</sup> National President beside the Sadie T.M. Alexander Law Scholarship, removed the word “and” after Campbell in the Bertha Pitts Campbell Education Scholarship, added “and” after the Vashti Turley Murphy Scholarship and placed the new Cheryl A. Hickmon Memorial Scholarship in the amendment. Motion adopted.
- Motion to adopt Amendment 12 – Quorum- Local chapters shall have no less than a 25% minimum quorum requirement – recommended change to no less than a 15% minimum quorum requirement. Motion adopted.

- Corporate report from Soror 1<sup>st</sup> National Vice President. Shared information on why sorors denounce. Grand chapter is receiving about 50 to 60 per month. Many say because of bad experiences during membership intake and spiritual reasons. 90,360 financial members, SAR has 17,586 financial sorors. 35 active disciplinary cases.
- National Secretary Report- Soror Moore- Discussed how data is shared and the policies management system. Development of the National Convention proceedings and Master calendar. Onsite workshops like the voting and alternate delegate orientation and certification. Maintains attendance at each plenary, conference and convention workbooks, Memorial Observance (1969 names to be read this year). There were 1603 names read at the 2023 Convention and 2059 names read during the Regional Conference Cycle.
- National Treasurer Report- Soror Glenn- DST is financially strong and sound. The Grand Chapter is able to meet all obligations. As of May 2025, 92,704 members and 954 chapters. Her goal is to reach 100,00 members. Dues cycle July 1, 2025 – October 15, 2025. Late fee begins October 16, 2025. Make sure your chapter's bonding and liability insurance is paid before the system shuts down.
- Strategic Planning Report- 56% of 900 chapters responded. All 100% of the National Leadership Team and Board of Directors responded to the survey. We must function as One Delta. Most chapters are working on aligning their activities to the Strategic Plan. Small chapters had the greatest response to the survey. The new incoming officers and Board of Directors will take a deeper dive into the survey elements and provide recommendations for the next 5 years.
- Strategic Partnership- Soror Arrington and Soror Farver; Soror Smalls- please review the Corporate Compliance document. It will be posted on the Natinal website after the convention. Scholarship and Standards will be hosting a Membership 101 workshop, working on revisions to the APMI, Step show guideline, Code of Conduct, Advisors workshop, new template for P&P, Membership Intake changes, and performance presentation guidelines. Membership intake numbers for Fall 2023 – Spring 2025: 39,459 applications with 11,642 members initiated. Information shared on new MI changes and Legacy pilot and results for new MI guidelines.
- Social Action Report- 226 current resolutions ranging from Civil Rights to Voting Rights.

- Soror Jamison and Soror Perry shared the election results. 830 votes certified and 11 chapters did not report.

### SAR President's Roundtable 9.4.25

Regional Director Soror Pamela Murphy Lewis and Regional Representative Soror Madison Manley Meeting was opened by Soror Melody Harris. Soror Lewis was at another Delta obligation. Soror Manley provided greetings.

- Meditation by Soror Yolanda Kennedy. Ecclesiastes 4: 9-10. *Two are better than one because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up.* You are never called to lead alone. Walk together because two is better than one. We are a sisterhood in leadership. Lead in unity, service and love. We are better together.
- Updates from Soror Manley on Project HERS. It will be held in Richmond, VA November 21<sup>st</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup>. There will be opportunities for chapters to assist with sponsorship via Destination 22.
- Update from Soror B. Lisa Downey-Hood- National Scholarship and Standards- The rules of order form (ROOF) is due annually and your chapter Policies and Procedures are due each year by June 30<sup>th</sup> even if you have no changes. The goal is to have all feedback to chapters by the end of September. Everyone needs to visit the Red Zone to verify your service area. Check your Memorandum of Agreements, as well. Soror Downey-Hood also shared Membership Intake updates. The Membership 101 webinar is posted on the National Website under Scholarship & Standards section.

#### New Membership Intake Information:

- Applicants will be required to upload a headshot to their application
- Leadership will be a scoring component
- The addition of situational and behavior-based interview questions
- "Are you a registered voter" question added to the application
- New refund policy (only local and national dues will be refunded)
- Lobbying will be allowed (members are only allowed to speak favorable of applicant; negative information may be shared with the chapter president only, who will then share with RD for discussion)
- Invitation only for Alumnae Rush (will not be implemented for the fall 2025 MI season)
- Decreased points for public service but an increase in points for leadership

#### Legacy Update

The following is the same as before:

- Must identify as a Legacy on the Application
- Must complete the Legacy portion of the Application with all required Legacy credentials
- Must meet ALL standard membership criteria
- New information-Mother/Grandmother of Applicant • Must be Financial for 5 consecutive years prior to the submission of the Legacy application. NEW • No current disciplinary action or outstanding fine as noted on the national website. Legacy Advocate • An advocate may complete the Legacy Certification application on behalf

of a parent/grandparent who is deceased. • The advocate must be financial at the time of the attestation. Does not have to meet the five-year consecutive membership.

- If All Criteria Have Been Met: • 10 Additional Points to Applicant Score • Applicant will be identified on the ballot as a Legacy. This process does not guarantee an offer of membership.
- A field has been added to upload a video of the NIP/DPR for RD approval
- Code of Conduct updates are coming

- Make sure you register your chapter as a charitable organization based on your state guidelines
